Searching for European information



The EU's own search engine to find information from EU Institutions & Agencies published on EUROPA, the EU's portal [EUROPA Search does not find information in EUR-Lex]



The European Journalism Centre set up this [Search Europa](#) service, which uses the superior power of Google to search the EUROPA portal [Includes results from EUR-Lex]



ECLAS is a major [bibliographic](#) index to help you find EU publications, academic books, journal articles, etc, on topics of interest to the EU [Hyperlinks to full text of sources if freely available]



You can search on EU Bookshop to buy printed copies or freely download electronic copies of EU [publications](#) [Not all older publications are available electronically. Does not include EU documents]

Searching for European information



REGISTER OF DOCUMENTS

The Registers of Documents from the [European Parliament](#), [Council of the European Union](#) and the [European Commission](#) + the [Comitology Register](#) can be used to find much 'unpublished' EU information not accessible via EUROPA

Archive Repositories




Google is obviously a further tool to use to find information from and about the EU and European information generally. However, do not assume that ALL such information can be found via Google.
NB: [Google Scholar](#) restricts search to more academic material





Use EUR-Lex to find details of national legislation that implements EU law and national case law concerning EU law



Use N-Lex to find sources of national legislation in most EU Member States. In some cases you can also search directly for national legislation



InterParliamentary EU information eXchange allows access to reports from national parliaments concerning EU legislative proposals and initiatives



COSAC is the Conference of the Committees of the National Parliaments of the European Union Member States



European Centre for Parliamentary Research & Documentation acts as a channel for requests for information whenever one parliament would like to know more about practice and policy in other countries



User-driven Multilingual News Gathering and Aggregation

The European Commission's **Joint Research Centre** (JRC) has developed a number of news aggregation and analysis systems to support EU institutions and Member State organisations. The three **Web Portals** [NewsBrief](#), [NewsExplorer](#) and [MedSys](#) are publicly accessible and attract up to 1.2 Million hits per day. The system was initially developed as an in-house application for the European Commission's Directorate General Communication (DG COMM) to replace their tedious and expensive manual media monitoring and press cutting services. Since then, EMM has become a crucial instrument in the daily work of almost all Commission services and many other public organisations. EMM is the news gathering engine behind a number of applications. EMM monitors the live web, i.e. the part of the web that has ever changing content, such as news sites, discussion sites and publications. All applications are developed, maintained and run by the JRC.



Monitoring the EU Budget

Member State websites providing information on beneficiaries of CAP payments (shared management)

under Article 44a of Council Regulation (EC) No 1290/2005 as amended by [Council Regulation \(EC\) No 1437/2007](#) and [Commission Regulation \(EC\) No 259/2008](#)

Article 44a of Regulation (EC) No 1290/2005 lays down that Member States have to ensure the annual ex-post publication of the beneficiaries of the European Agricultural Guarantee Fund (EAGF), and of the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD) and the amounts received per beneficiary under each of these Funds.

The purpose of the publication, which should be in accordance with the information held by the paying agencies in their books and records and which should only concern payments received in the preceding financial year, is to enhance transparency regarding the use of the Funds and improve their sound financial management.

The information shall be published by 30 April each year for the preceding financial year.

The information must contain the name of the beneficiary, the nature of the operations and the amount of public funding allocated to the operations. This map provides direct links to the lists of beneficiaries of the European Regional Development Fund and the Cohesion Fund available on the respective websites in the Member States. Please note that the information below is "Work in Progress" and subject to ongoing updates based on information that the Commission receives from the Member States. 
